



House Mouse
Mus musculus



The house mouse is believed to have “hitchhiked” its way here from Central Asia. It has since become the most economically important of all the commensal rodents, with annual costs associated with professional and homeowner management programs totaling 223.7 million dollars in the U.S. alone.

They are light brown to black in color range in size from 5”-8” long (including Tail) and weigh 0.5-1.1 oz. Mice are prolific breeders, on average females will have 6-10 litters in their lifetime containing 5-7 young, but can range from 2-13. These mammals are omnivorous and opportunistic foragers meaning they will eat anything from pet food to cockroaches, However due to their natural history of living in fields, grains and seeds are familiar foods and often preferred.
