



Flying Squirrels
Glaucomys volans



This squirrel has been kept as a human pet for hundreds of years. These adorable squirrels are both gentle and docile. These “Flyers” have spread northward over the past century and recently become a pest in peoples homes, sometimes forming fairly large colonies.

They are nocturnal, grayish brown with a white belly, a black ring around there large eyes. They are 9-10 inches long (including tail) and weigh 4-5 ounces. Using the fold of skin that stretched from the wrist to the ankle they glide from tree to tree (or tree to house). They feed on nuts (acorn, hickory black walnut), seeds and berries, bird eggs and nestlings, insects and bird feeders seed and suet. Two breeding seasons take place in February and June-July. Litters average 3 per.

Evicting flying squirrels can be accomplished using one way devices and careful and tedious exclusion. We guarantee all squirrel removal for 12 months.
